

Puzzles and Facts

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Start with school behind you and the playground in front of you

What animals can you see on the school wall?

	Turn left and walk up the road until you get to	
7	Star cottage. Take the path to the left	



When you get to a crossroads turn left.

What flower is the cottage on the right named after?

Keep walking down the lane

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Get to another cross roads

Can you see Laurel Cottage? There is something special in their garden tree- can you see what it is?

What did the building on the left used to be? How can you tell?

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6	Walk straight over, down the hill alongside the stream. Pass Milk Wood cottage on your right- be careful this road is quite steep!	What trees can you see on this path?
0	Keep walking along this path	There is a house named after a bird along here- can you find it?
8	Next, you will get to Fir tree cottage. Can you spot the fir tree it is named after?	Take a minute to appreciate the view and look over the valley. How many houses can you see from here?
9	Don't forget to look for different shaped windows throughout this walk! There might be one up high on the left shortly.	The round window is on Christmas Cottage- what is on their house sign?
10	Keep walking down the hill	Another animal themed house is on the left- can you find it?
	Take the left-hand path along the railings passing a house called Woodlands on the left.	Can you tell what their house sign is made from? Also what can you spot on the side of the house?
	Continue along the track heading slightly uphill	You will soon reach a bench on the right when was it put here?
18	Turn right after the bench, down some steps	How many steps are there?
14	Turn left downhill after you pass a house on the left-hand side	What do you think it used to be? How many colours can you count in the window?

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16	Keep going down the steps and turn left up the High Street	A house on the left has an unusual doorbell- what animal can you find on it?
17	Keep walking uphill, along the High Street towards the Red Lion pub	Although now houses you can still see the sign for the pub on the wall- what year was it established?
18	Walk to the left of the pub, past Chalford village shop.	What did this used to be, and when was it built?
19	Walk past a house on left with a pointed roof	Look carefully- what do you think this used to be?
20	Continue walking straight along this road	Don't forget to keep looking for different shaped windows!
21	Pass a spring on your left	This is Tankard spring, one of many natural waterways running through the village
22	Continue straight on, past Saratoga Cottage	Here is another animal doorbell- what it is this time?
23	Continue along the road	On the left is another animal themed house- what is this one?

24	Look for a fish themed house on the right-hand side	What type of fish is this? Can you count how many horseshoes are above the door?
25	Continue walking up the main road	What animal is climbing up the wall of Anchor House?
26	As you walk up hill you will see some stone arches built into the hill on the other side of the valley	What do you think these are?
27	Keep walking up the road towards the post box	Green Court on your right has been here for over 300 years. Previously it was 2 smaller houses, most likely used by weavers from the local Mill.
28	Walk down the hill and turn left at the corner cottage	There has been a house here since the 17th century although most were illegal until 1869.
29	Walk up the road with the stream on your left- hand side	
30	Walk straight on along the footpath and into the wood	Can you see any ponies? What other wildlife can you find along this track?
81	When you get to a T in the path turn left, cross the stream and go through the gate	
32	Turn left, walk up the slope and through the gate	What animal is on the Stroud rambling club emblem?

Continue through the trees

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34	When you reach the main road turn right	What type and colour flower is the cottage opposite named after?
35	Take the right-hand path after the church	What animal do you think used to use these tracks to travel around the village? A) Goat B) Donkey C) Horse
36	Turn left at the top of track, back onto the main road	Can you see any more different shaped windows from here?
87	Γurn right up the hill, back towards school	There is a Monkey Puzzle tree in a garden along here- can you spot it?
38	Arrive back at the school, Well Done! You have completed the Go Outside Chalford Hill trail!	Go back through- how many animals were included in this walk?
