


Minchinhampton Easter Trail

Puzzles and Facts

- Start at the Doctors Surgery on Bell Lane and head North.
- Turn right, staying on Bell Lane.

Welcome to the Minchinhampton Easter Trail! Which two animals are associated with Easter?

Pass Holy Trinity Church on your left.

There was originally a spire above the church but in which year do you think it was taken down?

Cross Butt Street, keeping the war memorial on your right.

Minchinhampton first appears in the Domesday Book but which year was this written?

Pass the Minchinhampton Market House then bear right onto Friday Street.

The 17th Century Market House was gifted to the town in 1919 and restored in 1944. There is a market held here on the first Saturday of every month.

6 Continue along Friday Street, passing the allotments on your left.

Which mythical creature did you just pass?

Cross Tetbury Street and head down the alleyway directly in front of you.

8	Turn left down Chapel Lane and cross into the field, following the yellow arrow.	What is the traditional Easter flower?
9	Head down the hill, following the trail, slightly towards the left.	
10	Cross over the gate; PLEASE BE AWARE THIS IS A WORKING FARM.	
11)	Head down the field, keeping to the right, and cross the stream at the bottom of the hill.	What food is traditionally made on Shrove Tuesday?
12	Head up the hill, passing the pond on your left.	
13	Turn left down Well Hill.	What is the name of the Sunday before Easter?
14	Turn right onto New Road.	
15	Turn Left down the alleyway.	How many large trees are on your left?
16	Continue across the fields, following the yellow arrow onto a path between farms.	
17	At the end of the winding path turn left and cross the field to your right.	Please be aware there are horses in this field.
18	Head down the field and exit bottom right.	How might this field and the surrounding area change in different seasons?
19	Head over the road and follow the path around to the right.	What type of bun do people eat at Easter? Why do you think this is?
20	Enter Box Wood.	
21	Take the left fork.	Which meal was eaten on Maundy Thursday?
2	Turn right onto the Devil's Elbow!	There is no clear reason why this is called the Devil's Elbow. It may be due to the particularly sharp type of bend, or from stories and folklore passed down through generations before us.
23	Follow the road as it bends to the left.
